Nearly always with him at the field was his Golden Retriever, Casey.

Some of his acknowledgements were Member of the Year and Top Gun awards as well as serving on the Board of Directors.

He was the club's informal welcoming committee for any visitors to the field and probably was responsible for many of the members joining us. I am sure we all agree that our club will never be the same without him.
