There was just a lone pilot at the field arriving around noon on this Friday. It was a bit cool, but the snow was perfect. The wind was a bit cross, but hey, there's no runway, or, maybe just one big take off and landing area. By 4p the wind went west and gusty – cross landings tricky.

Ski Fly Feb 12

The snow at the field was deep in places but about 3-4 inches on the runway. The first pilot took to the air around 10:30a. Snow conditions were perfect and the wind was straight down the runway. The second pilot took to the air around 11a. Conditions still great. But, around 1p the surface snow melted enough to make it “sticky” and it was difficult for models to get off the snow. Some innovative engineering made for some “paths” in the snow to make it easier to get airborne (see below). The wind came up around 3:30p and everyone went home.
